ANNEX 3 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. RULES

The Championship will be governed by the regulations as stated in CISM Sailing Regulations in conjunction with World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS 2016-2020), Match Racing Rules Appendix C to RRS. J-80 Class Rules will not apply. See more details in Notice of Race.

2. ELIGIBILITY

All competitors must be military personnel on full active duty in the Armed Forces of their respective nations (Article 7.21 (Participation –Military Status), Chapter 7, CISM Regulations, Edition July 2017). Such personnel must be in possession of a valid military identity card or a form of verification of military status accompanied by the athlete's official passport.

3. POINT OF ACCESS

Main point of arrival is Helsinki International Airport (HEL). Alternative point of arrival is Helsinki Seaport by ferry. The cost of the travel to and from the host country points of access must be covered by the participating nation. The organizer will provide local transportation from the points of arrival in the host country to the provided accommodation of the Championship.

Team may be a mix of males and females. Please indicate on the Final Entry Form. Additional persons are not accepted without a written agreement by the Chairman of the Organizing Committee.

5. WEATHER INFORMATION

In the month of June, maximum temperature is around 18°C and minimum temperature is 12°C (for an average temperature of 15°C). Winds might be variable, but on a warm day the sea breeze might catch up with approx. 3-5 knots.

6. CONDITIONS OF STAY

During the stay from 14 June to 21 June, in Helsinki, the participants will be quests of Finnish Defence Forces. Boarding, lodging and all local transportation arrangements to commence the championship schedule within this period will be at the expense of the organizer.

Extra expenses (telephone, cocktails, laundry etc.) as well as cost of travel to and from Helsinki, Finland are to be paid by the participants. Any cost before the due arrival date or after departure date including additional person's expenses must be covered by the participants.





7. VENUE

The championship will be organized at Finnish Naval Academy, Suomenlinna Sea Fortress on the outskirts of Helsinki. Venue site is reachable by Helsinki Region Transport ferry.

ANTI-DOPING

Anti-Doping tests will be conducted in accordance with the CISM Regulations – Chapter IX, CISM Anti-Doping Rules, the concerned CISM Sports Regulations, the concerned International Federation Rules, and all WADA rules, mainly the World Anti-Doping Code, and the International Standard for Testing.

The number and type of tests, as well the athletes to be tested shall be determined by the CISM Anti-Doping Commission. These procedures will follow the concerned CISM Test Distribution Plain (TDP).

In case an athlete has a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE), the Chief of Delegation should send this TUE to the CISM GS until 30 days before the Opening Ceremony. This TUE will be submitted to the TUE Commission to analysis and further approval.

9. UNIFORMS

Service uniform (summer) is required for the opening and closing ceremonies and for other official events. Sportswear will be usual attire for all activities at the competition site.

10. BOAT

The boat to be used in the championship is J-80 Class Boat modified for Match Racing. More information of the boat will be found at http://www.j80.org/.

11. FORMAT OF THE RACE

The format of the championship is Match Racing. Organizer has applied Grade 2 event level from World Sailing. World ranking points will be received accordingly.

12. REQUIRED ITEMS

Every participating nation shall bring:

- National Flag 400mm x 400 mm for the stern of the boat
- Sailing gear for every participant including certified life vest.

13. CUSTOMS, PASSPORT, VISAS AND HEALTH REGULATIONS

The participating nations are responsible for acquiring the necessary custom documents upon arrival at Helsinki, Finland. For information on immigration and visa requirements, please contact the nearest Embassy of Finland serving your nation.

14. MEDICAL

The organizer will take care of basic medical support (first aid) and emergency treatment only during the championship. In case of additional treatment, hospitalization and or routine medical care, participating nations will be responsible for the payment thereof.





15. REGISTRATION FORMS DEADLINES

Preliminary Agreement is attached as Annex 4 and must be returned NLT 15 March 2018.

Final Entry is attached as Annex 5 and Appendices 5a, 5b, 5c and 5d and must be returned NLT 15 May 2018.

ANNEX 5c - FINAL ENTRY - COMMITMENT BY THE CHIEF OF MISSION

To be returned before 15 MAY 2018.

Missions intending to compete must ensure that they submit these forms timeously and no later than the date indicated. The Organizing Nation shall not have any obligation towards member nations which have not provided the official final entry within the deadline set in the invitation file (Article 8.3, item 4, CISM Regulations, Edition July 2017)

NATION:			

The undersigned, Chief of Mission declare that he has read the CISM Regulations and moreover understood the following prescriptions:

Article 1.10. RIGHTS OF MEMBER NATIONS

- A. Active member nations have the right to:
 - 2. Be invited top all CISM Championships.
- B. Inactive member nations have the same rights as active member nations except that:
 - 2. They do not participate in any CISM event until they have met their financial obligations.

Article 7.21. PARTICIPATION - MILITARY STATUS

- Only military personnel on active duty in Armed Forces may take part in competitions organized by CISM.
- B. No one may be recalled to active duty in the Armed Forces for the purpose of participating in a CISM competition. In the case of an intermittent military service, the athletes regularly recalled may not take part in CISM competitions, under any circumstances, if more than 18 months have elapsed between this recall and the end of their last call to arms.
- C. Exceptions to the above may be authorized by the General Assembly, upon recommendation of the Board of Directors.
- D. All military participants in a CISM event shall be in possession of proper documentation which signifies active military service of the member nation he represents. The documentation can be:
 - A valid military identity card for those athletes who are authorized to present their military identity cards abroad,
 - 2. A form of verification (in English and/or French) of military status accompanied by a passport.
- E. By signing the final entry, the Chief of Delegation confirms the military status of the participating athletes. If there are last minute changes in the participation of the athletes, the verification file may be signed by the Chief of Mission, but shall be confirmed by the Chief of Delegation by official letter.
- F. If one of these documents is not available, participation is refused.





Article 7.24. PARTICIPATION OF AN INACTIVE MEMBER NATION

Athletes or teams of an inactive member nation may not participate in any CISM event (art 1.10 of the Regulations).

Article 7.30, CHIEF OF MISSION

A. Chief of Mission

- Chiefs of Mission shall be familiar with CISM regulations.
- Missions must not only participate or be present at sports events, they are also required to participate in information conferences on CISM, study days, commemorative and cultural events and ceremonies organized by the host nation.

B. Conduct of a mission

- The Chief of Mission is responsible for the behavior of his team in sports and general discipline. He shall ensure that members of his mission respect the rules and directives prescribed by CISM and organizers of the championship. The respect of schedules is particularly important as they form the basis for the effective conduct of competitions and ceremonies.
- The Chief of Mission shall also enforce the rules concerning behavior and dress during the ceremonies. He plays an important role in promoting the CISM spirit among his mission, a spirit represented by friendly attitude towards other missions, courtesy towards organizers and fair-play in competition.

Article 8.6. ABSENCE OF A MISSION WITHOUT NOTIFICATION

If a mission which submits a preliminary agreement and/or final entry is absent without notifying the host nation in time, a sanction will be imposed (CISM Regulations, Art. 1.12).

Article 8.17. RULES OF STAY

A. General

- The Chiefs of Mission are responsible for the discipline of their mission. The
 missions fall under the jurisdiction of the organizing nation. During events, all
 athletes present on the playing fields are equal before the jury, the referees
 and to themselves. No one may use his rank to impose his views on sports
 matters.
- Civilian members of the missions shall conform to the discipline accepted by all other participants.

B. Military uniforms

 Unless otherwise approved by the Official CISM Representative, all participants shall wear military uniform during official ceremonies such as the opening and closing ceremonies and medal-awarding ceremonies. Individuals without proper uniform will not be allowed to participate in the championship.





2. The presentation of medals takes place, in principle, during the closing ceremony. The presentation of medals may be done in sports uniform, if for organizational reasons it is not possible to wear military uniforms. This is the case e.g. when the presentation immediately follows a championship sports event. Sports uniforms shall respect the corresponding national criteria (training suit, sports shoes, etc.) Displaying the national flag on the podium by the recipient (athlete or team) at a medal awarding ceremony is forbidden. Individuals failing to respect these prescriptions shall not receive their medal(s) during the official ceremonies.

C. Forbidden actions

- In conformity with the statutes and traditions of CISM, any political or religious propaganda during a CISM event, in particular the dissemination of documents, pictures, brochures, reviews, etc. is strictly forbidden.
- 2. Any contravention shall result in the exclusion of the mission from further competition and may result in additional sanctions (Regulations Art. 1.12).

Article 8.19. ACCOMMODATIONS

- A. All missions, including those of the host nation, shall be accommodated under the same conditions. If the conditions are in accordance with the CISM norms and standards, the missions are expected to accept the accommodation provided by the organizing nation.
- B. Any mission that does not accept the accommodations provided by the organizing nation and judged as adequate by the Official CISM Representative will not be allowed to participate in the championship.

ANNEX 5d - FINAL ENTRY - SAILOR AGREEMENT

To be returned before 15 MAY 2018.

Missions intending to compete must ensure that they submit these forms timeously and no later than the date indicated. The Organizing Nation shall not have any obligation towards member nations which have not provided the official final entry within the deadline set in the invitation file (Article 8.3, item 4, CISM Regulations, Edition July 2017)

NATION:	

The skipper and team is responsible for the following things:

- To report any occurred damages with "L" flag to the RC and the damage to the Sailboat Service team as soon as possible.
- Before unrigging the boat AT THE DOCK the team must do a thorough check of the boat. All tapings (regardless of who has done it during the day) and trash must be removed from the boat. The spinnaker, genoa and barber hauler ropes must be coiled and put inside the boat. The "L" and "Y" flags must also be put inside the boat. All water from inside the boat must be removed.
- All sails must be checked for damage and rolled or foiled according to the instructions of the Sailboat Service team. Dry sails are put inside the boat, wet left outside so the Sailboat Service team can take them to dry.

The damage quarantee the teams are required to sign for at registration is 1.800 EUR.

In case of damage on water, a first assessment will be done by the Sailboat Service team. At shore a second assessment will be done to verify and determine the amount of possible cost of the damage. The charges below are applicable where it is obvious that damage/loss was because of misuse/negligence by the user. The extent of the damage is decided by OA Sailboat Service team. The maximum deduction for any single occurrence is 1.800 EUR.

In cases where the cost of a repair cannot immediately be determined (e.g. grounding, major collision) the maximum deposit (1.800 EUR) will be charged. After the repairs are done, any deposit left over will be refunded to the skipper.

If a team is seen sailing in the restricted area, the team will receive 1 warning. If the same team is seen to sail in forbidden area a 2nd time the team will have to pay a penalty fee.

This Sailing Contract is applicable during WMSC2018 competitions and the related training sessions. The team hereby acknowledges and agrees with the terms of this sailing contract of WMSC2018. In case of damage invoice has to be sent, it will be sent to the skipper or Chief of Mission. The team has 2 weeks to pay the invoice. The skipper agrees to send a verification e-mail to sailingcenter@njk.fi when the payment has been made.

ANNEX 6 - FINAL ENTRY - NOTICE OF RACE

1 ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The Organising Authority (OA) will be Finnish Defence Forces / Finnish Navy / Finnish Naval Academy and Nyländska Jaktklubben r.f

2 VENUE

The venue will be Helsinki, Finland.

3 EVENT GRADING

The event has applied for World Sailing Grade 2.

This grading is subject to review by World Sailing. The event may be re-graded when there is clear reason to do so.

4 PROVISIONAL PROGRAMME

- 4.1 Schedule
 - (a) Race office open from 14th June at 0800.
 - (b) Registration from 14th June 0900 until 14th June 2100.
 - (c) Crew weighing from 14th June 0900 until 14th June 2100.
 - (d) Practice from 14th June 0900 until 1800 and 15th June 0900 until 1800.
 - (e) CSCS Preliminary meeting 15th June 0800.
 - (f) First briefing at 16th June 0800.
 - (g) First meeting with umpires 16th June 0830.
 - (h) Opening Ceremony on 15th June 2000.
 - (i) Racing days from 16th June to 20th June.
 - (j) Time of the first race each day will be 0930.
 - (k) The latest time for an attention signal on the last day of racing will be 1730.
 - (I) Daily press conference 45 minutes after the last race of each day.
 - (m) Prize giving on date at 20th June 2000.
- 4.2 Unless excused by the OA, attendance at the following is mandatory:
 - (a) Initial briefing for skippers.
 - (b) Daily briefing, for skippers.
 - (c) Daily press conferences, for skippers sailing that day.
 - (d) Opening Ceremony for the skippers and crews.
 - (e) Closing Ceremony for the skippers and crews.
 - (f) Prize giving for the skippers and crews.
 - (g) Closing dinner for skippers and crews.
- (h) CISM official meetings; Preliminary meeting and CSCS Enlarged Technical meeting as per separate invitation.





5 SKIPPERS ELIGIBILITY

- 5.1 Only skippers invited by the OA will be eligible to enter this event.
- 5.2 The registered skipper shall helm the boat at all times while racing, except in an emergency.
- 5.3 To remain eligible a skipper shall confirm acceptance of the invitation in writing to be received by the date specified on the letter of invitation.
- 5.4 SPARE
- 5.5 All competitors shall meet the eligibility requirements of World Sailing regulation 19.2.
- 5.6 All competitors shall obtain a World Sailing Sailor ID by registering online at www.sailing.org/isafsailor. ID's shall be informed to the OA in Final Entry Form.

6 ENTRIES

- 6.1 Entering
 - (a) The skipper/team shall be entered on completion of registration and crew weighing.
- 6.2 Entry Fee
 - (a) No entry fee.
- 6.3 Withdrawal
 - (a) When a skipper accepts an invitation and later withdraws within two months of the event or leaves the event before the end without written approval from the OA, a zero score may be applied to their Ranking points for that event by World Sailing. (World Sailing Regulation 27.2)
 - (b) If a mission which submits a preliminary agreement and/or final entry is absent without notifying the host nation in time, will be sanctioned according to CISM regulations Art 1.12.

6.4 Damage deposit

- (a) An initial damage deposit commitment for 1800 € is applicable in WMSC2018. Sailing Contract shall be signed and sent to the OA NLT with the Final Entry. This deposit is the maximum payable by the skipper as a result of any one incident.
- 6.5 SPARE

7 RULES

7.1 Applicable rules

- (a) The event will be governed by the rules as defined in the RRS, including Appendix C.
- (b) The rules for the handling of boats will apply, and will also apply to any practice sailing and sponsor races. Class rules will not apply.
- (c) Any prescriptions of the national authority that will apply will be posted on the official notice board.

7.2 Major Alterations to the RRS

- (a) Add to RRS 41: (e) help to recover from the water and return on board a crew member, provided the return on board is at the approximate location of the recovery.
- (b) RRS C8.6 and C6.3 will be changed in the sailing instructions.





7.3 International Jury

(a) An International Jury will be appointed in accordance with RRS Appendix N.

7.4 SPARE

8 BOATS AND SAILS

- 8.1 The event will be sailed in J80 class keelboats modified for Match Racing.
- 8.2 Seven (7) boats will be provided.
- 8.3 The following sails will be provided for each boat: Mainsail, Genoa, Jib and Symmetrical Spinnaker.
- 8.4 Boats will be allocated by draw, either daily or for each round as decided by the race committee.

9 CREW (INCLUDING SKIPPER)

- 9.1 The number of crew (including the skipper) shall be 4 or 5. All registered crew shall sail all races.
- 9.2 The total weight of the crew, including the skipper, dressed in at least shorts and shirts shall not exceed 350 kg, determined at the time of registration or such time as required by the RC.
- 9.3 When a registered skipper is unable to continue in the event the International Jury may authorise an original crew member to substitute.
- 9.4 When a registered crew member is unable to continue in the event the International Jury may authorise a substitute, a temporary substitute or other adjustment.

10 EVENT FORMAT

- 10.1 Skippers will be seeded into a round robin or divided into two or three groups based on World Sailing ranking list 30 days prior to the event.
- 10.2 The event will consist of the following stages:
 - Stage 1 a single round robin, a double round robin or a double round robin in groups.
 - Stage 2 Semi Finals
 - Stage 3 Finals
- 10.3 The RC may change the format, terminate any stage or the event when, in its opinion, it is impractical to attempt to hold the remainder of matches under the existing conditions or in the remaining time scheduled. Early stages may be terminated in favour of later stages.

11 COURSE

- 11.1 The course will be windward/leeward with starboard rounding, finishing downwind.
- 11.2 The intended course area will be in front of City centre of Helsinki (Kruunuvuoren Selkä or Hernesaarenranta).





12 ADVERTISING

- 12.1 As boats and equipment will be supplied by the Organising Authority, World Sailing regulation 20.4 applies. Each boat will be required to display advertising as supplied by the OA.
- 12.2 SPARE.
- 12.3 SPARE.
- 12.4 Boats shall not be permitted the right to protest for breaches of any rules regarding advertising (amends RRS 60.1).

13 PRIZES

- 13.1 Official CISM medals will be awarded for the crews according final results 1st 2nd and 3rd.
- 13.2 Fair Play Trophy will be awarded for the chosen crew as stated in CISM Sailing Regulations.
- 13.3 All participants will receive a diploma.
- 13.4 There might be additional prizes.

14 MEDIA, IMAGES AND SOUND

- 14.1 If required by the OA:
 - (a) Television personnel and equipment (or dummies) supplied by the OA shall be carried on board while racing.
 - (b) Competitors shall wear microphones supplied by the OA during racing and be available for interviews when advised by the OA or RC.
 - (c) Registered skippers shall wear communications equipment supplied by the OA that will allow commentators to communicate with them whilst racing.
- 14.2 Competitors shall not interfere with the normal working of the OA supplied media equipment.
- 14.3 The OA have the right to use any images and sound recorded during the event free of any charge.

15 CISM BOAT, VIP AND COACH BOATS

- **15.1 SPARE**
- 15.2 The OA will provide boats from which Chief of Missions, Team Captains and coaches may observe racing and communicate with their teams between matches. Individual coach boats will not be permitted.
- 15.3 OA provided boats will be marked as per CISM Sailing Regulations.
- **15.4 SPARE**
- 15.5 Any interference by these boats with the racing boats or event organisation may result in a penalty applied at the discretion of the IJ to the associated skipper or team.

16 OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- 16.1 Each team is requested to provide a national flag min 400mm x 400mm for display from the stern of the boat.
- 16.2 Each team is requested to bring own sailing gear including personal floating device.
