RULES OF MILITARY AERONAUTICAL PENTATHLON CHAMPIONSHIP IN THE NORDIC FRAMEWORK

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

1.1 Rules

The rules of the Military Aeronautical Pentathlon Championship in the Nordic framework and the CISM Military Aeronautical Pentathlon (MAP) regulations are complied with each other.

The CISM regulations and international rules is applicable and are valid unless decreed otherwise by the rules of the Military Aeronautical Pentathlon Championship.

Exceptions to rules due to special reasons shall be specified in an invitation, and they shall be accepted by other nations at a preliminary meeting before a competition. Other changes to be made by the organizer shall also be described in an invitation.

The regulations of the MAP apply to participants in the Military Aeronautical Pentathlon Championship with the exception that all military personnel serving in the armed forces of their respective countries may take part in the latter.

1.2 Time

The competition is preferably held from week 20 to week 26 (Monday to Friday).

1.3 Composition of Mission

Each country is represented by one (1) to three (3) male teams, one (1) to three (3) female teams and four (4) other members of a mission. The mission of each nation shall consist of no more members as follows:

1 chief of mission

1 team captain

1 coach

1 referee (fencing or ball contest, organizer will provide required information in an invitation)

Maximum 15 competitors

A team shall consist of a maximum of nine (9) male competitors and six (6) female competitors. The number of male competitors can be increased to 9 if this is allowed by the organizer. This possibility must be mentioned in an invitation. The organizer may permit additional competitors, such as cadets, from the organizing country. Drivers or crews of transport aircraft are not included in a mission count. The organizer can extend an invitation to non-Nordic countries to participate in the Nordic Military Aeronautical Pentathlon Championship (General Rules).

2. ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

2.1 Normal schedule:

1 st day	Arrival, training, meeting, drawing of lots
2 nd day	Shooting, fencing
3 rd day	Ball contest, swimming, MAP evening
4 th day	Obstacle course and orienteering, prize-giving ceremony
5 th day	Departure

2.2 Ceremonies

As a rule, ceremonies shall be organized in such a way that their range and form will not affect the flexibility of arrangements of the competition. However, they shall have the value deserved by the Nordic Military Aeronautical Pentathlon Championship. The flags of the participating nations shall be placed in a prominent position.

The opening ceremonies shall be arranged at a suitable time during the first day in an appropriate venue such as a parade ground, lunch room, or officers' club. The ceremonies shall include brief remarks by the commander of the host unit in which he welcomes the participants and declares the Nordic Military Aeronautical Pentathlon Championship open.

An informal dinner shall be arranged in a free and easy atmosphere enabling to create coherence between the teams of the different nations. Even though there will be no dress code, sports clothes or equivalent outfits will not be allowed.

The closing and prize-giving ceremonies shall be arranged on a parade ground or an equivalent place if time permits.

2.3 Uniform

The participants shall wear uniforms in the closing ceremony.

3 REGULATIONS OF COMPETITION

3.1 Juries

The members of the Technical Jury and Jury of Appeal are selected among the invited nations before the competition. The Director of the Championship cannot belong to a jury. At least two members of the jury are required to be present in every event. Any protests will be treated immediately.

3.2 Individual and Team Competitions

A competition is open for both individual competitors and teams. Every nation enters its teams by advising the organizer of the names of the competitors before the beginning of the competition. The team of each nation consists of four (minimum three) named competitors. Three named competitors who have achieved the highest scores form team 1. The fourth competitor forms team 2 together with the two next best competitors (and so on). In case of an injury or illness, teams will be filled from the number bigger team (ex 3 -> 2 ->).

Female competitors will compete on their own team competition using the female scoring table or she/they will be counted on the male team competition according to the male regulations (except for obstacle course) if the jury so decides in the technical meeting. The team of each nation consists of three (minimum two) named competitors. Two named competitors who have achieved the highest scores form team 1. The third competitor forms team 2 together with the next best competitor (and so on).

3.3 Championship

The competitor/team that achieves the highest score among the Nordic nations will be the Nordic Champion in Military Aeronautical Pentathlon.

3.4 Contest Number

In orienteering, a competitor's contest number must be fastened on his/her front. In fencing, a contest number can be fastened, if necessary, on the competitor's leg, back, or mask. In the ball contest, numbers shall be visibly displayed.

3.5 Event Related Regulations

3.5.1 Shooting

The shooting contest is carried out according to the CISM Military Aeronautical Pentathlon (MAP) Regulations. Air pistol shooting will be arranged according to the ISSF final regulations (with 20 shots). A 3-minute preparation time will be followed by a warm-up time of 5 minutes.

3.5.2 Fencing

The fencing contest is carried out according to the CISM Military Aeronautical Pentathlon (MAP) Regulations except for the following items:

- If the organizer assumes that the contest time will exceed 6 to 8 hours by a considerably margin, the Technical Jury can direct that the contest be carried out as 1-hit fencing.
- The lowest number of matches shall be minimum 20. In case of fewer matches, the competitors shall fight with each other twice. The Technical Jury decide that the entire contest be carried out as 1-hit fencing.
- The female competition will be 3-hit/2minutes (as the males fencing)
- The number of rounds is to match the scoring table and achieve a minimum of 20 matches.

3.5.3 Ball contest

The ball contest is carried out according to the CISM Military Aeronautical Pentathlon (MAP) Regulations.

3.5.4 Swimming

The swimming contest is carried out according to the CISM Military Aeronautical Pentathlon (MAP) Regulations.

3.5.5 Obstacle Run

The obstacle run is carried out according to the CISM Military Aeronautical Pentathlon (MAP) Regulations.

3.5.6 Orienteering

Orienteering is carried out according to the CISM Military Aeronautical Pentathlon (MAP) Regulations except for the following items:

- A map can be changed during the contest.
- Degree of difficulty is red (B (A) level)
- The organizer shall emphasize the importance of getting a winning time of 60 to 70 minutes.

3.6 Scoring of Points

The scoring of points shall be performed according to the Military Aeronautical Pentathlon (MAP) Regulations.

4 AWARDS

Awards are distributed according to the General Rule, § 8. Challenge Trophies are distributed according to the regulations stated in Appendix 1 to this Rule.

5 RESULTS

The lists of results shall be copied to all participating teams and published on CISM's website. Scoring the points of fencing shall be performed when all participants placed in one pool. Scoring the points of swimming, obstacle run, and orienteering shall be performed after all results have been given. In accordance with the General Rule, the lists of the results shall be sent with the minutes of the Technical Committee's meeting to the respective nations.

If the competition is Nordic Open Military Aeronautical Championship, Nordic Military Aeronautical Championship results will be counted separate from Nordic Open Military Aeronautical Championship competition.

6 MEETINGS

The Nordic Military Aeronautical Pentathlon Championship consists at least two meetings. A technical meeting will be held on the arrival day, and an enlarged Nordic Technical Military Aeronautical Pentathlon meeting will convened at a time of convenience. An example agenda for the Enlarged Nordic Technical Military Aeronautical Pentathlon Meeting is given below:

- Opening the meeting and the approval of the agenda
- Marking attendees
- Approval of the minutes from the previous meeting
- Revision of new general regulations for the Nordic Military Aeronautical Pentathlon Championship (and MAP)
- Calendars
- Lesson learned
- Other issues
- Closing the meeting
