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
# HOST COUNTRY: RUSSIA

## General Status of the Host Country

Russia is vast. Russia is endless. Russia is timeless and eternal. Yet Russia can still surprise. Bounded by 12 seas of the Atlantic, Arctic and Pacific Oceans, the country's 17.1 million km include one-eighth of the earth's inhabited surface area. In addition to being the largest, the Russian Federation is one of the world's northernmost countries. It encompasses from its borders with Finland, Estonia, Latvia, Belarus, and Ukraine on the west to the Bering Strait in the far northeast and from its borders with Georgia, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Mongolia, and China in the south to the Arctic Ocean in the north.

European Russia, the most densely populated, urbanized, and industrialized region, lies between the Ukraine-Belarus border and the Ural Mountains. Seventy-eight percent of the population lives in this area. Two large industrial cities are located above the Arctic Circle: Murmansk on the Kola Peninsula and Norilsk in Siberia.

Russia is a country of incomparable beauty, variety and extremes, encompassing the snow-capped peaks of the Ural and Caucasus mountains, the seemingly infinite Siberian forests, the broad rivers stretching across the continent and deserts and grasslands of its central steppe. Russia is the land of Lake Baikal - the deepest and purest on Earth - and of the Volga, the longest river in Europe. No other country extends across nine of the earth's twenty-four standard time zones; as Russians in Vladivostok sit down to enjoy their evening family meals, their countrymen in Kaliningrad are rising to greet the sun's morning rays.





## Political Status of the Host Country

Political system of Russia.

Russia is a democratic federal rule-of-law state with the republican form of government. It consists of republics, territories, regions, federal cities, an autonomous region and autonomous areas - equal subjects of the Russian Federation.

Russian is the official language.



The political system established by the Constitution of 1993 provides the president with substantial superiority over other branches of the state. The president is elected for a term of six years by the citizens of the Russian Federation on the basis of general, equal and

direct vote by the secret ballot. No-one may hold the office for more than two terms in succession. A candidate for the President of the Russian Federation can be nominated by a political party or by the candidate personally. In the latter case the candidate must have an initiative group of 500 supporters.

The Federal Assembly, the Parliament of the Russian Federation, is the supreme legislative body of the Russian Federation. The Federal Assembly consists of two chambers, the Federation Council and the State Duma. The State Duma is elected for a term of five years. It consists of 450 deputies. From 2007 all deputies are elected in proportion to the number of votes cast for the lists of candidates nominated by political parties.

The Federation Council consists of two representatives from each Subject of the Federation, one from the representative and one from the executive bodies of the Subject of the Federation.

The Government consists of the Chairman of the Government, Deputy Chairman of the Government and federal ministers. The Chairman is appointed by the president with consent of the State Duma. If the State Duma thrice rejects candidates for the Chairman of the Government nominated by the president, the president appoints a Chairman of the Government, dissolves the State Duma and calls a new election.

The Prosecutor's Office of the Russian Federation is a single centralized system in which lower prosecutors are subordinated to higher prosecutors and the Prosecutor-General. The Prosecutor-General is appointed to the post and relieved from it by the Federation Council on nomination by the President. Prosecutors are appointed by the Prosecutor-General.



## **Economic Status of the Host Country**

The economy of Russia is a high-income mixed economy with state ownership in strategic areas of the economy. Market reforms of the 1990s privatized much of Russian industry and agriculture, with notable exceptions in the energy and defense-related sectors.

Russia is unusual among the major economies in the way it relies on energy revenues to drive growth. The country has an abundance of natural resources, including oil, natural gas and precious metals, which make up a major share of Russia's exports. As of 2012 oil and gas sector accounted for 16% of the GDP, 52% of federal budget revenues and over 70% of total exports.



Russia has a large and sophisticated arms industry, capable of designing and manufacturing high-tech military equipment, including a fifth-generation fighter jet. The value of Russian arms exports totaled \$15.7 billion in 2013—second only to the US. Top military exports from Russia include combat aircraft, air defense systems, ships, submarines. The Russian economy is the sixth largest in the world by PPP.

## **Cultural Status of the Host Country**

### **History of culture**

In order to understand Russian culture one must realize that it is a unique symbiosis of European and Asian traditions. Russia has part of its roots in European culture where the ideas of goodness, honor, and freedom have similar meaning as in the West. The Mongols, conquered Moscow in 1234 and Kiev in 1240, and controlled Russian lands for over 200 years. That brought Tatar blood into Slavic mix, creating modern Russian nation.

When Moscow liberated itself from the Tartars in 1480, the modern Russian state was born. Distant from Europe, the new state was cut off from Constantinople which in 1453 had fallen to the Muslim Ottoman Turks.

The Russian Orthodox Church, isolated from the rest of Christianity, developed independently as a national church.





## Modern culture

Living for centuries in a very harsh climate explains the Russians' strength, their ability to endure extreme hardship, and their occasional bleak outlook on life - but only to the non-Russian observer. Russians themselves never consider their life miserable. Hardships also help develop such abilities as simplifying things (complex mechanisms break in tough climates, think Kalashnikov and other Russian military armament). Russians tend to find way around obstacles.

Russian culture produced a number of world famous artists and writers. Literature would not be the same without Leo Tolstoy, Fyodor Dostoevsky or Joseph (Iosif) Brodsky. Here you can read more about Russian art.

Russians consider themselves a well-educated nation. They read a lot of books. They attend theater, Russian ballet is very popular around the world. Russia produces world's top mathematicians and physicists.

## Orthodoxy

Russian Orthodoxy, a branch of Christianity, is deeply rooted in Russian culture. The majority of Russians are Christians. Church marriage is not official in Russia.

## Russian folklore

Folklore is still very popular in Russian cities and towns. You may have heard about Palekh Art, Russian «basnya» poems and folk songs. Traditions is what keeps Russian Culture unique and alive to this day.





## Sports Policies and Status of the Host Country

Sport has always been one of Russia's top national priorities. Soviet and Russian athletes have always been prominent on the international sporting stage, excelling in Olympic sports and among the top medal winners at the Olympic Games and World Championships.



The Federal Government allocates substantial funds to develop both high performance sports and citizen participation. Federal target programs have been launched to promote sport to the public as a fundamental social activity. The Federal Government allocates substantial funds to develop both high performance sports and citizen participation. Federal target programs have been launched to promote sport to the public as a fundamental social activity. The government strongly believes that healthy lifestyle choices in a variety of sports will lead to a healthier society. At the same time, hosting major international sporting events provides a perfect opportunity to welcome guests from all over the world, share the celebration of sport and youth, and increase the social benefits created by these events.

The success of the bidding campaigns is an extraordinary example of the government's commitment to hosting international sports events: in 2013 Kazan hosted the 27th Summer Universiade, in 2014 the Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games were held in Sochi, in 2015 the FINA World Aquatics Championships, FINA World Masters Championships was held in Kazan.





Sochi was chosen as the host city for the **3<sup>rd</sup> CISM World Winter Games** at the 70<sup>th</sup> General Assembly and Congress of the International Military Sports Council in Kuwait City, Kuwait in 2015. The Games were held in sports venues built for the 2014 Winter Olympic Games.



Russia was the host nation for the 2018 FIFA World Cup. The matches were held in the stadiums of 11 various Russian cities, namely, Kaliningrad, Kazan, Moscow, Nizhny Novgorod, Rostov-on-Don, Saint Petersburg, Samara, Saransk, Sochi, Volgograd and Yekaterinburg. This was the first football World Cup ever held in Eastern Europe, and the first held in Europe since 2006. Russia will also host games of the Euro 2020.



# HOST CITY: SAINT PETERSBURG

## Host City Information

### Introduction to Saint Petersburg

Saint Petersburg is Russia's second-largest city after Moscow, with 5 million inhabitants in 2012, part of the Saint Petersburg agglomeration with a population of 6.2 million. An important Russian port on the Baltic Sea, it has a status of a federal subject (a federal city).

Saint Petersburg is often considered Russia's cultural capital. The Historic Centre of Saint Petersburg and Related Groups of Monuments constitute a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Saint Petersburg is home to the Hermitage, one of the largest art museums in the world. Many foreign consulates, international corporations, banks and businesses have offices in Saint Petersburg.

A proponent of westernizing Russia, Peter the Great, who established the city, originally named it, Sankt-Peterburg. On 1 September 1914, the Imperial government renamed the city Petrograd, meaning "Peter's city". On 26 January 1924, shortly after the death of Vladimir Lenin, it was renamed to Leningrad, meaning "Lenin's City". On 6 September 1991, the original name, Sankt-Peterburg, was returned. Today, in English the city is known as "Saint Petersburg". Local residents often refer to the city by its shortened nickname, Piter.

The city's traditional nicknames among Russians are the Window to the West and the Window to Europe.

The northernmost metropolis in the world St. Petersburg is often called the Venice of the North or Russian Venice because of its structure which is built



on water and its strongly European-inspired architecture, which is combined with the Russian heritage too. Furthermore, St. Petersburg is called Venice of the North because of an annual natural phenomenon called White Nights which arise due to the closeness to the polar region. Just as Venice is associated with romance, in St. Petersburg the White Nights have a high value for love couples.

Unlike in Moscow, in Saint Petersburg the historic architecture of the city centre, mostly consisting of Baroque and neoclassical buildings of the 18th and 19th centuries.

The oldest of the remaining building is a wooden house built for Peter I in 1703 on the shore of the Neva near Trinity Square. Since 1991 the Historic Centre



of Saint Petersburg and Related Groups of Monuments in Saint Petersburg and Leningrad Oblast have been listed by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site.

The appearance of St. Petersburg includes long, straight boulevards, vast spaces, gardens and parks, decorative wrought-iron fences, monuments and decorative sculptures. The Neva River itself, together with its many canals and their granite embankments and bridges help to give the city its particular ambience. Saint Petersburg has a significant historical and cultural heritage.



The 18th and 19th-century architectural ensemble of the city and its environs is preserved in virtually unchanged form. For various reasons (including large-scale destruction during World War II and construction of modern buildings during the postwar period in the largest historical centres of Europe), Saint

Petersburg has become a unique reserve of European architectural styles of the past three centuries. Saint Petersburg's loss of capital city status helped the city to retain many of its pre-revolutionary buildings, as modern architectural 'prestige projects' tended to be built in Moscow; this largely prevented the rise of mid-to-late-20th-century architecture and helped maintain the architectural appearance of the historic city centre.

Saint Petersburg is inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage list as an area with 36 historical architectural complexes and around 4000 outstanding individual monuments of architecture, history and culture. New tourist programs and sightseeing tours have been developed for those wishing to see Saint Petersburg's cultural heritage.



The city has 221 museums, 2000 libraries, more than 80 theatres, 100 concert organizations, 45 galleries and exhibition halls, 62 cinemas and around 80 other cultural establishments. Every year the city hosts around 100 festivals and various competitions of art and culture, including more than 50 international ones.

The musical life of Saint Petersburg is rich and diverse, with the city now playing host to a number of annual carnivals.



Ballet performances occupy a special place in the cultural life of Saint Petersburg. The Petersburg School of Ballet is named as one of the best in the world. Traditions of the Russian classical school have been passed down from generation to generation among outstanding educators. The art of famous and prominent Saint Petersburg dancers like Rudolf Nureyev, Natalia Makarova, Mikhail Baryshnikov was, and is, admired throughout the world.




### **Weather Conditions**

Saint Petersburg experiences a humid continental climate of the cool summer subtype (Köppen: Dfb), due to the distinct moderating influence of the Baltic Sea cyclones. Summers are typically cool, humid and quite short, while winters are long and cold but with frequent warm spells. The average winter minimum is about  $-9^{\circ}\text{C}$  ( $16^{\circ}\text{F}$ ), and the record low temperature is  $-35.9^{\circ}\text{C}$  ( $-33^{\circ}\text{F}$ ), recorded in 1883. Solid frozen ground is a normal part of winter there. The Neva River within the city limits usually freezes up in November-December (recent years in January), while break-up occurs in April. On average there are 123 days with snow cover (stable from December to March), which reaches the average of 24 cm (9.5") by February. The frost-free period in the city lasts on average for about 135 days. There is some temperature variation within the city limits, and the city itself experiences a climate slightly warmer than its suburbs. Weather conditions are, however, quite variable all over the year.



The highest temperatures of July and August were reached in 2010.

Average annual precipitation varies across the city, being about 600–750 mm per year on average and reaching maximum in late summer and in the north. Though this number is not high by itself, soil moisture is almost always excessive because of low evapotranspiration due to the cool climate. Relative humidity of air is also high (78% on average), and overcast is common throughout the year (165 days a year on average).

## 2. CUSTOMS AND IMMIGRATION

Further to an analysis, it is possible to assert that the implementation of the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG is compatible with all the regulations and the opposable legal procedures to this day.

### 2.1 VISAS

To be allowed on the Russian territory, any foreigner shall possess one valid passport (still valid 6 months after their return to their country) and shall present a travel document accepted by the Russian authorities, one visa (for the countries falling under that bond) as well as the justifications related to their conditions and durations of stay.

It is highly recommended that each participating nation contacts the embassy of the Russian Federation in their respective country for specific information regarding to entry procedures and VISA information into the Russia. Failure to do so may cause refused entry into the Russian Federation.

**Delegations of countries that require a visa to enter the Russian Federation must complete «Final Entry - Personal data for accreditation and visas support to visit the Russian Federation». And send to CADOC with color scanned copies of the first page of the valid passports of all members of the delegation in full size and in good quality before 6 June 2022.**


### 2.2 CUSTOMS PROCEDURES

At instigation of the inter-ministerial delegation to the big sports events, the airport services will be sought so that, in the respect for the obligations of control, all the measures are taken to facilitate the passages in customs of delegations, their goods: relieved formalities, dedicated lanes.

The missions will take a special attention to fill the documents about the temporary entry of weapons, munitions and drugs on the Russian territory. This is a key point. If you don't respect that point you will have some problems to enter in Russia or you won't be allowed to enter in Russia.

### 2.3 CURRENT SANITARY RULES AND VACCINATIONS

No vaccination is at present compulsory to enter Russia. It is however recommended to consult the site of the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs.

Given the nature and aims of CISM, no discrimination is allowed against any country or person on ground of ethnic groups, religion or political affiliations.



## 5. PARTICIPATION

### 5.1 INVITATION

The whole information about this subject is described in the invitation and its enclosure.

### 5.2 PARTICIPANTS

#### 5.2.1 MILITARY STATUS

CISM is by definition a military sport organization. Only personnel in active duty as defined in CISM regulation, art.7.21 may take part in the CISM World Games. Every CISM Delegation, in active status has the right to participate in the CISM CWG. The up-to-date list of active/inactive CISM Member Nation may be obtained upon request to the CISM General Secretariat.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM Cadet World Games are opened to all student who comply with the above definition. During the Cadet Games, all participants must hold the official valid cadet identity card from their respective military educational institution (or at least a copy) or a form of verification (in English) of military status with passport. Any cadet who fails to present such a cadet ID or form will not be authorized to take part at the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM Cadet World Games and the CADOC shall not have any obligation toward this individual (no board and lodging).

The accompanying people, such as coaches, doctors, journalists or drivers shall be preferably military personnel too. Nevertheless, civilian members are accepted. These civilian missions must conform to the disciplinary rules accepted by all other participants. By signing the Final Entry, the Chief of Delegation confirms the active military status of the participating athletes. If there are last minute changes in the participation of the cadets, the verification file may be signed by the Chief of Mission, but shall be confirmed by the CoD by official letter.

#### 5.2.2 AGE LIMIT

Following the CISM basic principle of universality of its Military Games and the decision of the CISM BoD. CISM has set up the age categories from **17 to 26**, as lower and upper limits. There is absolutely no discrimination against sex, religion, races or political origins. Participation of women is strongly encouraged.

All competitors must satisfy the following conditions:

- > Be a national of the country they represent
- > Should turn 17 and not be more than 26 in 2022 - cadets born from 01.01.1996 till 31.12.2005 will be entitled to participate in the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM Cadet World Games.



### 5.2.3 COMPOSITION OF A MISSION


Teams sent by their nations to participate in the Games are called "Mission". Any mission can participate in all different sport or in only some of them.

The composition of the mission is therefore directly linked to the choice of sport in which the mission will participate. The following table lists the different members of mission per sport and represents the maximal composition of a mission.

Delegations are required to strictly respect the standard composition of a participating mission.

CADOC has no financial or organizational obligation toward people who are not included in the mission (relatives, spectators, etc.) No additional member may be included in the mission without special authorization from the Organizing Country. In all cases where the composition is not respected, mission must pay the extra lodging cost (150 USD per day per head).

A mission participating in the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG is composed by Mission Officials, VVIP's, CISM VIP's, Journalists (Military Media) and Competitors.

For any doubt and/or clarification, please contact the CADOC.



**a. CHIEF OF MISSION**

Every participating country shall designate a Chief of Mission who shall be entitled to represent his country. A Chief of Delegation attending the Games must be the Chief of Mission. \*The only exception admitted: Board of Director’s members + OCR’s.

**b. DEPUTY CHIEF OF MISSION**

When the size of the Mission exceeds 30 individuals, every country can designate a deputy Chief of Mission according to the following table:



Any exception must be discussed and authorized by the CADOC, prior to the Final Entry.

**c. REFEREES AND JUDGES**

Any mission attending the volleyball competition must bring at their own cost 2 international referee (1 for men’s competition and 1 for women’s competition). In case a mission cannot bring with their mission the mentioned referee, a written request must be sent to the organizer along with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Preliminary Agreement of participation. In such case, the CADOC may provide the required referees. The CADOC kindly request the referees to bring their current standard uniform (if any) received from the correspondent International Volleyball Federation in order to standardize the uniforms and also to wear the official ones determined by the FIVB.

For some sports (e.g. Shooting) the CADOC together with the PCSC will determine which countries are requested to send no more than 2 Jury-members.





### **5.2.3.2 SPORT OFFICIALS**

For the complete details regarding the sports official belonging to each sport, please refer to the "Handbook II"- Sports Information.

#### **a. MISSION DOCTOR OR PHYSICIAN**

- > The missions can bring more doctors or physician than foreseen in the composition of mission of each sport as long as they respect the proportion table of item 5.2.3.1.

#### **b. DRIVER OR AD-LIBITUM**


### **5.2.3.3 JOURNALISTS (MILITARY MEDIA)**

Each country has the right to come to the Games with 3 military journalists (military media), as part of their mission. They will receive accreditation via Organizing Committee. The company selected to be the CISM Partner for TV, Broadcasting and Right Distribution (Host Broadcaster) should be informed if military media are coming with cameras.

CADOC will give them a specific document explaining that their images could only be used for internal needs and could not be distributed to their local press and media as the selected company is responsible to sell and distribute images to worldwide media.

#### **NOTE:**

All other people, such as spectators, relatives, friends, etc. are welcome to the Games and can obtain entrance ticket to the ceremonies and to the sport events. They have to organize themselves their board, lodging and local transportation (if possible due to the COVID-19 pandemic).





## 5.2.4 MODIFICATION OF THE COMPOSITION OF A MISSION

Certain flexibility must be applied in such cases. A good communication between the CADOC and the participating missions is essential to solve any misunderstanding.

### **Before June 6, 2022**

For any modification in the composition of the mission (officials, VVIP, CISM VIPS, Sports officials or competitors) it is highly recommended to use of the e-mail registration.

### **After June 6, 2022 and before July 20, 2022.**

Any modification in the composition of the mission (officials, VVIP, CISM VIP, Sports officials or competitors) shall be done by the use of a Late Replacement Form (LRF). This form is part of the Invitation File. It could be downloaded on the website, filled in and mailed back to the CADOC at the following **address:** [CWGRussia2022@gmail.com](mailto:CWGRussia2022@gmail.com).

## 5.3 WITHDRAWAL OF THE WHOLE MISSION

Such nation would have to pay a penalty charge to be fixed by the BoD at its meeting. Any nation not informing the Organizing Committee of its withdrawal in addition to the above administrative cost will also have to pay another penalty the amount of which charge to be determined by the BoD at its meeting.

### 5.3.1 WITHDRAWAL OF A PART OF THE MISSION

If a mission does not bring an athlete or team (teams sports) previously enrolled in the final entry, they will have to pay a penalty charger per capita to be fixed by the BoD at its meeting, according to a proposal from CADOC. Any payment shall be done to the CADOC upon arrival and registration in Russia. Any mission refusing to pay the penalty charge will be refused participating in all events.

## 5.4 TRAVELLING

As a general rule, travelling expenses of participating authorities and missions to the venue of the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM Cadet World Games are borne by the delegations they belong to. Local transportation will be organized by the CADOC.



## 5.5 ARRIVAL

### 5.5.1 GENERAL

As a general rule, missions are required to strictly comply with the scheduled arrival dates fixed in the General Schedule of Events of the "HANDBOOK II - Sports Information".

If your mission is arriving split on various groups, please specify the different flights.

### 5.5.2 EARLY ARRIVAL OF AN EXPECTED MISSION

The expense incurred before 4 August and after 12 August 2022 shall be borne by respective missions.

In principle, the CADOC will not accept Missions arriving before the scheduled dates. In all cases, missions arriving too early must pay the extra accommodation costs at the rate of **150 USD per day per head** to the Organizing Committee upon their arrival. In case the mission is not able to pay these accommodation costs the mission will not be allowed to participate in the Games.


### 5.5.3 LATE ARRIVAL OF AN EXPECTED MISSION

- a. Before the preliminary meeting  
Expected missions will have normal participation.
- b. After the preliminary meeting (drawing of lots)

**Before the start of the competitions** - Expected missions will have normal participation. During the preliminary meeting, the athletes and teams are placed by drawing of lots following the same procedure as the Nations present.

**After the start of the competitions** - Expected missions will be allowed to compete following the planned program. The drawing of lots for the coming events will not be repeated. The teams and individuals of the missions concerned are placed, at the convenience of the Technical Jury, in those positions which will not affect the drawing of lots.

For individuals: all events not participated in are lost.





#### **5.5.4 ARRIVAL OF AN UNEXPECTED MISSION**

The CADOC will not accept the participation of these missions. The missions not sending the Final Entry till the deadline must request their participation to the CADOC before arriving in Russia.

If the CADOC authorizes the participation and the mission arrives after the Preliminary Meeting on no account should the events in progress or those already completed be repeated. Participation in events not yet started is accepted. The planned program is applicable. The drawing of lots of the coming events will not be repeated. Teams and individuals of the missions concerned are placed, at the convenience of the Technical Jury, in those positions that will not affect the drawing of lots.

#### **5.6 DEPARTURE**

##### **5.6.1 GENERAL**

As a general rule, missions are required to strictly comply with the scheduled departure dates fixed in the invitation. If your mission is departing split on various groups, please specify the different flights.


##### **5.6.2 EARLY DEPARTURE**

No sanctions will be applicable if an athlete or a mission leaves the Games with the approval of CISM because of absolute necessity or in case of emergency (e.g. injuries, flight connection problems, death of a family member, etc.).

##### **5.6.3 LATE DEPARTURE**

In all cases, missions leaving after the fixed date must pay extra accommodation costs at the rate of **150 USD** per day per head. For any doubt and/or clarification, please contact the CADOC.

**If the missions need for extending because the problem of flight schedule, please inform at the Final Entry Form.**





## **6. RULES OF STAY**

### **6.1 PROGRAM OF STAY**

Upon arrival in Russia, the participants will receive an Information Package (Welcome Pack/Guidebook) containing the complete program of stay. The following information will be particularly detailed:

- > General calendar - Detailed calendar and schedule of all competitions (minute by minute program).
- > Place and date of the Opening and Closing Ceremony.
- > Place and date of the various meetings.
- > Place and date of official receptions.
- > Dress regulations for the various occasions.
- > Security matters.
- > Appropriate maps of the different locations.
- > Addresses and telephone numbers of the different embassies, military attaches, etc.
- > Information and tourist guides may also complete the file of the Organizing city and its surroundings.

### **6.2 DISCIPLINARY MATTER**

The Chiefs of Mission at the Games are responsible for the behavior of their mission. The missions fall under the jurisdiction of the Russia. During the Games, all athletes present on the competition areas are equal before the jury, the referees and themselves.


No one may use his rank to impose his views on sports matters. Civilian Members of the missions must conform to the disciplinary rules accepted by all other participants.

### **6.3 DRESS CODE**

#### **6.3.1 MILITARY UNIFORM**

All cadets must wear their national military (summer) academy uniform during official ceremonies such as the Opening Ceremony of the CISM Cadet World Games. Cadets without proper uniform will not be allowed to participate in the Games.

The presentation of medals can be done in sports uniforms, if, for organizational reasons it is not possible to wear military uniform, for example, when the presentation immediately follows a competition sports event. But, whenever possible, the medal ceremony will be done in uniform to enhance the military character of the Games.





### **6.3.2 NATIONAL TRACK SUIT**

It is highly recommended for competitors to have at least one official track-suit (training) and official jersey/polo, preferably in the national colors with the name of the country, official shorts, socks and sport-shoes. Caps are not mandatory.

### **6.3.3 CIVILIAN DRESS**

Civilian dress may be worn on cultural activities organized by the CADOC as well as during the free times between the competitions and ceremonies.

### **6.4 ADVERTISING**

All advertisement during the sports competitions and medal awarding at the competition areas and in the accommodation sites has to be in accordance with the regulations of the relevant International Federation and CISM rules.


All types of advertisement which goes against ethics, or the spirit of sport and CISM are strictly forbidden.

Any infringement to this rule shall automatically result on immediate disqualification of the athlete/team.

As a general rule in CISM, any advertisement of tobacco and/or alcohol is strictly forbidden.

### **6.5 FORBIDDEN ACTIONS**

In conformity with the statutes and traditions of CISM, any political or religious action during the Games, in particular the dissemination of propaganda documents, pictures, brochures, reviews, etc. is strictly forbidden. Any contravention shall result in the exclusion of the mission from further competition and the case shall be referred to the CISM Discipline Commission.






## 7. BOARD AND LODGING

### 7.1 CATEGORIES CONSIDERED FOR LODGING

The CADOC commit itself to accommodate in full board and lodging any official registered participant in the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG. This accommodation will respect the following table:


## **7.2 MEALS AND DRINKS**

Meals and drinks will both be balanced and substantial and meet the requirement of sport dietetics. As much as possible, the following points will be taken into consideration:

- Traditions particular to race and religion;
- Medical requirements and prescriptions;
- Schedule of events
- The CADOC will provide free of charge non alcoholic drinks during meals and water throughout the duration of the competitions.

## **7.3 EXTRA EXPENSES**

Extra expenses including telephone, laundry and drinks must be paid by the consumers. Any cost before the foreseen arrival and/or the departure date, must be covered by the participants.





## 8. TRANSPORTATION

### 8.1 TRAVEL EXPENSES

As a general rule, travelling expenses of participating authorities and missions to the venue of the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM Cadets World Games are borne by the delegations they belong to. Local transportation is mandatory from all the accommodation sites to all the sports competition and official venues; these costs will be borne by the Organizing Committee.

CADOC will prepare a transportation plan for the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG period taking into consideration the following points:

**a) Individual cars:** with drivers or individual cars with drivers + liaison officers or liaison officers only will be provided by CADOC for each of the following number of authorities:

- > CISM President
- > CISM Vice-Presidents
- > Official CISM Representatives – OCRs
- > CISM Secretary General
- > CISM Games Director
- > 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG Project Manager
- > PCSCs


**b) A special shuttle service:** to transport the CISM BoD Members, Chiefs of Mission, CISM HQ Staff, CSC Members, from their hotels to the sports venues and vice-versa;

**c) Shuttle service:** to transport the participants:

- > From the Pulkovo International Airport / Saint Petersburg railway station to the accommodation site(s) and vice-versa.
- > From the accommodation site(s) to the sports venues and vice-versa.

**d) Special cars with drivers will be made available for each PCSC and its members.** Transportation to & from the venue in the longest before the arrival and departure of the athletes is required and should be considered part of the transport plan.

**e) The CADOC:** will ensure that the drivers are suitably trained as such and that they have a satisfactory knowledge of the local geography. In cases where dedicated cars will be used for extended periods of time, the CADOC shall contemplate using more than one shift of driver per car.





## **9. MEDICAL CARE AND INSURANCES**

### **9.1 MEDICAL CARE**

Medical centers on the athlete's accommodation will be established to deal with minor cases. Serious cases will be treated at a full service hospital. First aid and evacuation service will be available on sport venues and athlete's accommodation.

The CADOC will bear all necessary emergency (first aid) hospital/medical center care expenses.

All other expenses, such as hospitalizations, surgical operations and any other special treatments, repatriation in case of disease by illness or accident, other expenses on account of illness/accident such as compensation loss of income or non-emergency dental/medical care will be charged to the user themselves.

If for any reason the injured athlete's delegation refuses the medical arrangements proposed by the CADOC the costs of hospitalization or treatment at other facility will be the responsibility of the delegation.

In case the mission brings any drugs to treat its team and the staff, it has to declare so through the proper form named "Declaration of Drugs Form" which you can find enclosed to the forms of the Final Entry.

### **9.2 COVID-19 PANDEMIC**

3<sup>rd</sup> CISM Cadets World Games will be organized in accordance with CISM COVID-19 Guidelines, as well as the regulations from the Russian health authorities.

All participating countries will be informed about the rules and measures that must be followed during their stay the Russian Federation.

Further information will be continuously provided online.

### **9.3 INSURANCE**

The CADOC will not be responsible for any claim for loss, injury or damage arising from the holding of the Games.

Points related to medical coverage:

> for the organizing country: obligation to give first aid and to take care of the hospital. CADOC can practice non-invasive sports medicine.

> for the guest nation: obligation to take out insurance for all the care that can be given to the persons in the delegation.

CADOC is not responsible for post-injury medical follow-up, nor for any medical or psychological consequences resulting from the injury.

The Missions must have the appropriate insurance to cover travel, accidents and health risks including COVID-19 disease as they are not under the responsibility of the CADOC nor CISM.



## 10. SECURITY AND ACCREDITATION

### 10.1 General Aspect

The CADOC, through its Security and Intelligence Office, is responsible for the security of all authorities, missions and guests during the competitions, official transportation and at accommodation sites, authorized stay.

### 10.2 Security Measures

All participating delegations and national staff will be registered and will receive the appropriate credentials to access the sports venues, lodgings and all sites that they require. The use of accreditation will provide the necessary control and security measures ensuring the smooth flow of personnel while restricting access of non-authorized persons, providing a safe environment for all.

**Delegations must complete «Final Entry - Personal data for accreditation and visas support to visit the Russian Federation». And send to CADOC with color photos in good quality (35mm\*45mm min size in the format of .JPG, with the resolution rate no less than 300dpi) of all members of the delegation before 6 June 2022.**

## 11. ENTERTAINMENT

### 11.1 CULTURAL DAY

Guided tours of the host city will be planned for participants. The tours will take the participants around the important tourist sights of city Saint Petersburg.

### 11.2 CISM MEETING POINT - CISM CLUB

As one of the major CISM aims is to promote relations between military athletes of all nations, CADOC will make available in each of the athlete's accommodation a place where the athletes can meet and exchange information including:

- > Information center (transportation, banking facilities, entertainment, guided tours, etc.).
- > Postal office.
- > News stand (photos, magazines, etc.).
- > Notice board for CISM information.
- > Stands for program and results distribution.
- > Convenience store.
- > Lounge bar with TV.
- > Public Phones.
- > Games room.
- > LAN House with Internet Points.
- > Display of awards and souvenirs connected with the competitions.





## 12. COMMAND & CONTROL

The Command & Control Office will provide the IT and Communications facilities to carry out and coordinate the 3<sup>rd</sup> CWG. The CADOC will provide an internet web site to ensure and enable the appropriate dissemination of relevant data before and during the Games. The results dissemination will be also part of the Games site.

## 13. CEREMONIES AND PROTOCOL

### 13.1 MILITARY CHARACTER

All events shall bear a military character and include ceremonies which enhance their prestige. The following rules and recommendations support this purpose and CADOC will respect and use them as an operational basis, with all due respect to the protocol and the military traditions of its nation.

### 13.2 OPENING AND CLOSING CEREMONIES

For the Opening Ceremony the missions in their **national military uniforms**, led by their team captains and flag bearers, enter the stadium and assemble according to French alphabetical order. The team of the host nation is the last to enter the stadium. The flags of the participating nations are already hoisted in the same order.

After the entrance of the missions, the flag of the Host Country is hoisted to the sound of the National Anthem and after that the CISM flag is hoisted to the sounds of the CISM anthem. The CISM flame is lightened. The ceremony program will be the responsibility of the CADOC and must be submitted for approval to CISM. Spectacular opening show demonstrating the host nation's cultural, human and sport patrimonies will be held. The CISM President and a dignitary of the Host Nation will pronounce a welcome address.

The Closing Ceremony of the Games is performed in the same practical manner as the Opening Ceremony. For the Closing Ceremony the missions in their **national military uniforms**.

### 13.3 DIPLOMATIC REPRESENTATIVES

In order to lend CISM events a more official character and to encourage friendly relations between the governments of member countries, representatives of the national Ministry of Defense and diplomatic representatives from all participating nations are invited to the Games.

## 14. PRESS AND MEDIA SUPPORT

The CADOC will provide an efficient and quality infrastructure for all accredited press that will work before, during and after the Games.

All sport venues will have special areas and services exclusives for the journalists (written press, radio, TV) and photographers. An international



broadcasting transmission signal of the image of the Games will be available. CADOC will offer an International Broadcasting Center and Press Center located near the majority of the competitions venues, with easy access and facilities to all accredited press.

#### **14.1 PRESS**

Accredited journalists will have access point to free internet in all press areas of the Games. Photographers will also have a special service with photo positions in all fields of play, working room.

#### **14.2 MEDIA SUPPORT**

The radio and TV host broadcasters that will broadcast the Games will also have a dedicated service for their professionals. Accredited journalists will have access to all official information through the Official Website as well, and during the Games we will provide a Daily Highlights with the main images of the day




# HANDBOOK II

## SPORT INFORMATION

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## 1. GENERAL TERMS

The sports events of the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG shall be organized in accordance with the most recent CISM Sports Regulations, CISM Regulations (version July 2021) and the technical rules of the appropriate International Sport Federation, unless otherwise stated.

The composition of a mission explained in the following pages is considered as the maximal one and cannot be overspent. For further information on the composition of the mission, refer to the point 5.2.3. of Handbook I.

## 2. SPORTS AUTHORITIES

The authorities per sport are:

- > The Official CISM Representatives (OCR)
- > The President of the CISM Sports Committee (PCSC)
- > The General Sports Manager (GSM)
- > The Technical Jury (TJ)
- > The Jury of Appeal (JA)

### 2.1 THE OFFICIAL CISM REPRESENTATIVE (OCR)

There will be 3 OCR's, with following group of sports:

2 OCR - for Military Pentathlon, Orienteering, Shooting and Summer Biathlon.

1 OCR - for Swimming, Volleyball and Track & Field.


For all of these sports organized at the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG, the CISM CWG CC shall designate OCR who will be appointed by the CISM Board of Directors and selected among the 4 Continental Presidents and/or BoD members. However, the BoD may appoint another delegate to officially represent CISM. The OCR cannot act as Chief of Mission at the same time.

Each OCR will be technically assisted by the Presidents of the concerned CISM Sports Committee.

The Secretary General officially notifies the designated representatives and the CADOC of the appointment of these 3 OCR's for the Games.

The CADOC will officially invite the OCRs at least 4 months prior the Games. The OCR shall address a letter to CADOC (with a copy to the Secretary General) to confirm his participation.

If the OCR designated should, at the last minute, be unable to attend the Games or to fulfill his mission, he must notify the Organizing Committee and the Secretary General accordingly, so that alternative measures may be taken.





## **2.2 THE PRESIDENT OF THE CISM SPORTS COMMITTEE (PCSC)**

CISM has a Sports Committee which is responsible for the overall technical aspects of the concerning sport/discipline of the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG.

During the Games, the role performed by the CSC and its President is of prime importance.

For details on the exact functions and roles played by the CSC and PCSC, please refer to the CISM Regulations, Art. 2.15,16.

## **2.3 THE GENERAL SPORT MANAGER (GSM) AND VENUE MANAGERS (VM)**

CADOC has appointed Colonel Oleg Parkhomenko, e-mail: [CWGRussia2022@gmail.com](mailto:CWGRussia2022@gmail.com) as the General Sports Manager, responsible for all sport events during the Cadet Games. For each sport venue of the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG, CADOC will appoint Venue Managers.

PCSC and GSM will be responsible for the overall technical aspects of all disciplines of the Cadet World Games.

The Venue Managers will be in charge of all matters, technical, organizational and administrative for that sport/discipline/venue.


In 2021, when Russia will host the PCSC pre-visit and inspection in order to control the venues and to coordinate with the CADOC, the VM's should be already nominated and they must participate in this pre-visit.

## **2.4 THE TECHNICAL JURY (TJ)**

For each sport programmed during the Games, a Technical Jury shall be set up. For details on the exact functions and roles played by the TJ, please refer to the CISM General Regulations, Art. 8.12.

## **2.5 THE JURY OF APPEAL (JA)**

For each sport programmed during the Games, a Jury of Appeal shall be set up. For details on the exact functions and roles played by the JA, please refer to the CISM General Regulations, Art. 8.13.





### **3. OFFICIAL MEETINGS**

The various official meetings held during the Cadets Games are essential to a sound organization and are largely responsible for the smooth running of the Games. They are the following:

- > Preliminary and Technical meetings.
- > Meetings of the Technical Jury.
- > Meetings of the Jury of Appeal.
- > Meeting of the Anti-Doping Commission.

All aspects of these meeting are described in the CISM General Regulations, Art. 8.28.

### **4. RECORDS**

All aspects for CISM World Records are described in the CISM General Regulations, Art. 8.36.

In Shooting each winner will have automatically a new CISM Cadet World Record, because it is the first time we will have this kind of competition. We will have for 25m and for 200m totally new Shooting Program.

### **5. AWARDS**


All information concerning the criteria for the attribution of official medals per event at the Games will be made available in the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG Regulations and are described in the CISM General Regulations. The awards will be presented at the end of each competition, at which time the winner(s) will be saluted by the playing of the national anthem, while the national flags of the medal winners are raised.

### **6. PROTESTS**

The procedures for handling any protest concerning competition matters are described in CISM Regulations, Art. 8.13-letter F.

### **7. DOPING TESTS**

Anti-doping tests will not be carried out during the 3<sup>rd</sup> CISM CWG.



## 9.7 SUMMER BIATHLON (CROSS DISCIPLINES)

### 9.7.1 REGULATIONS

The competitions will be conducted in accordance with the most recent International Biathlon Union (IBU). Event and competition rules ([www.biathlonworld.com](http://www.biathlonworld.com)) and the most recent CISM Skiing Regulations (edition 2021).

**Shooting will be held with small bore rifles (Izhmash 7-4 biathlon rifle)/ammunition (0.22) provided by the organizing committee.**

**In addition to a different method of movement, the cross biathlon has the following main differences from the winter biathlon:**

- Rifles while athletes running part of a distance are in the pyramids on the shooting range; biathletes take them, coming to the shooting range, and leaving, put it back;
- The length of the penalty circle (in all disciplines except for the individual race) is 70 meters;
- Does not apply the rule of removing from the race athletes who have lagged behind the leader in full circle

**The disciplines in which athletes compete have the same names as in winter biathlon, however there are differences in the regulations:**

- Sprint - the distance is 4 km for men and 3 km for women.
- Individual Race - the distance is 7 km for men and 6 km for women. The penalty for a miss is 30 seconds.
- Relay - Consists of 4 stages. The length of one stage for men is 4 km, for women - 3 km.


