GENERAL INFORMATIONS

A. Right to participate in the 23rd CISM World Military Equestrian Championship (Show Jumping), France.

At the request of the organizing committee, in order to ensure perfect organization, only nine (9) CISM active member nations have the right to participate in the 23rd World Military Equestrian Championship (Show Jumping), France 2022. The selection (France and ideally 2 per continent), will be studied and finalized by a selection committee, composed of the organizing committee and the CSC.

Applications from nations will be ranked according to their order of arrival. The selection of the 8 participating nations will be carried out according to the priority principle of 2 nations per continent. Vacancies will then be allocated according to the order of arrival of the applications.

D. Access to the Location of the Competition.

The travel cost to the host country and respective return will occur under the responsibility of the participating country.

The organizer will provide local transportation from the points of arrival in the host country to the provided accommodation of the Championship in Fontainebleau and the transport during the competitions as well.

The points of arrivals are:

1. Orly Airport. IATA code ORY, OACI code LFPO
2. Charles de Gaulle Airport. IATA code CDG, OACI code LFPG
3. Paris train station.

E. Conditions of Stay.

During the stay from the 4th to the 10th of October, in Fontainebleau, the participants will be considered guests of the French Delegation to CISM. Boarding, lodging and all the local transportation arrangements to commence the championship schedule within this period will be at the expense of the organizer.

Extra expenses (telephone, cocktails, laundry etc.) as well as costs of travel to and from Brest, France, are to be paid by the participants. Any cost before the due arrival date or after departure date including additional person's expenses must be covered by the participants.

Additional people will not be accepted without official written permission of the organizers.

The organizer will take care of medical support (first aid) and emergency treatment only during the championship. In case of additional treatment, hospitalization and or routine medical care, participating nations will be responsible for the payment.

F. Regulations of the Championship.

- CISM Regulations (Uploaded on 13/12/2021).
- CISM Anti-Doping Rules (Uploaded on 17/06/2020).
- The Championship will be governed by the regulations as stated in CISM Regulations for Equestrian Sporting events – 2021.
- All competitors must be military personnel on full active duty in the Armed Forces of their respective nations (Article 7.23 (Participation – Military Status), Chapter 7, CISM Regulations, Edition December 2021). Such personnel must be in possession of a valid military identity card or a form of verification of military status accompanied by the athlete's official passport.

G. Anti-doping.

Anti-Doping test will be conducted in accordance with the CISM Regulations – Chapter IX, CISM Anti-Doping Rules, Federation d'Équitation Internationale Rules and all WADA rules, mainly the World Anti-Doping Code, and the International Standard for testing.

The number and type of tests, as well the athletes and horses to be tested shall be determined by the CISM Anti-Doping Commission. These procedures will follow the concerned CISM Test Distribution Plan (TDP).

In case an athlete has a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE), the Chief of Delegation should send this TUE to the CISM General Secretary until 30 days before the Opening Ceremony. This TUE will be submitted to the TUE Commission for analysis and further approval.

H. Uniforms.

Uniform is mandatory all the stay long. Not forget an everyday uniform (summer dress, combat dress etc), a competition uniform and a formal ceremony uniform.

<p>Uniforms are mandatory (summer dress) for the opening and closing ceremony.</p>	
<p>Parade dress or Class A uniform is mandatory for the technical meeting and the authorities and chief of mission cocktail (suit and tie for civilian authorities).</p>	
<p>Civilian clothes may be worn for welfare activities and touristic visits.</p>	

I. Horses and equipment.

Horses and equipment will be provided by French military equestrian sports.

Horses must be able to perform a 1,20m show jumping course.

J. Customs and Visa Procedures.

The participating nations are responsible for acquiring the necessary custom documents upon arrival at Fontainebleau.

For information on immigration and VISA requirements, please contact the nearest French Embassy of serving your nation.

K. Weather Conditions.

Fontainebleau climate is a temperate climate.

The October average temperatures vary from 8°C (46°F) to 15°C (59°F).

It can rain.

L. Registration Forms Deadlines.

Preliminary Agreement is attached as Annex 1 and must be returned **NLT June 16th, 2022.**

Final Entry is attached as Annex 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 and must be returned **NLT September 5th, 2022.**

Missions intending to compete must ensure that they submit these forms timeously and no later than the date indicated.

The Organizing Nation shall not have any obligation towards member nations which have not provided the official final entry within the deadline set in the invitation file (Article 8.3, letter A, item 4, CISM Regulations, Edition December 2021).

The participating mission should inform both valid phone and fax numbers in the final agreement form, as well as their email address in case of the organizing committee needs to get in contact.

N. COVID Restrictions and prevention.

Please note that World Military Equestrian Championship (Show Jumping) will be organized following the French regulations from the French health authorities.

The following guidelines have been issued by CISM French using the collective feedback of different stakeholders in the sport of equestrian.

The guidelines will be updated continuously according to the latest information from the World Health Organization and the research/ publications that are released on this topic.

Each country has their own conditions of access that must be followed. Since the 9th June 2021 the flux of travelers between France and foreign nation have re-opened according to specific modalities copyright to the health situation of the foreign nations and the vaccination status of the travelers.

A specific health protocol will be established for non-vaccinated persons and persons vaccinated with non-France / EMA recognised vaccines issuing from "amber" or "red" designated countries.

Also consider that the event will look different to what we all are used to, as some of the measures will have an impact on how the event looks like. Here are the measures that will affect :

- All participants will be subjected to an antigenic test carried out by French military health service (SSA). This control will be held before accessing the inprocessing.
- In the case of a positive PCR test, the totality of the delegation will not be authorised to participate and be isolated at an specific accommodation site.
- Competition access is subject to the presentation upon arrival of a « sanitary pass » which can be constituted by eithers :
 - A full vaccinal schedule with vaccines recognised by France / EMA.
 - A negative PCR or Antigenic test with less than 24 hours latency.

- A certificate attesting recovery from Covid-19.
- Face mask mandatory fulltime except competition and training. Chief of mission/ Team Manager Face mask mandatory fulltime.
- CISM French will not facilitate any interviews with athletes before or after the event, so that athletes don't have to be in close contact with any external media personnel. Athletes can do it at their discretion, preferably in open air spaces.
- Individual Responsibility :
 - Participants should aim to keep at least two meters distance from other people.
 - Frequent hand washing by participants using soap and hot water or alcohol-based (at least 65-70%) hand rub for 20 seconds.
 - Avoid shaking hands or hugging.
 - Avoid steam rooms or sauna.

Athletes racing in a sailing event must monitor their health status continuously (including taking their temperature and monitoring for any symptoms) from 14 days before and during the event.

Depending on the evolution of the health crisis, the Organizing Authority may modify the conditions of registration and / or eligibility.

In the unprecedented context of "COVID 19", the Organising Authority may cancel the competition.

We kindly request that your delegation bring their anthem on CD or in a memory stick (The anthem can be sent to organizer by email in mp3 format) and one (1) national flag.

FINAL ENTRY - COMMITMENT BY THE CHIEF OF MISSION

To be returned before **September 05th, 2022**

NATION :

The undersigned, Chief of Mission declare that he has read the **CISM Regulations** and moreover understood the following prescriptions :

Article 1.10. RIGHTS OF A MEMBER NATION

- A. Active member nations have the right to :
Be invited to all CISM Championships.
- B. Inactive member nations have the same rights as active member nations except that :
They do not participate in any CISM event until they have met their financial obligations.

An inactive nation, intending to take part in the event must pay its annual fee before the deadline established by the Organizing Committee of the world military championship for sending the final entry. If it is not done, the delegation will not be able to take part in the event.

Article 7.23. PARTICIPATION - MILITARY STATUS

- A. Only military personnel on active duty in Armed Forces may take part in competitions organized by CISM.
- B. No one may be recalled to active duty in the Armed Forces for the purpose of participating in a CISM competition. In the case of an intermittent military service, the athletes regularly recalled may not take part in CISM competitions, under any circumstances, if more than 18 months have elapsed between this recall and the end of their last call to arms.
- C. Exceptions to the above may be authorized by the General Assembly, upon recommendation of the Board of Directors.
- D. All military participants in a CISM event shall be in possession of proper documentation which signifies active military service of the member nation he represents. The documentation can be:
 - 1. A valid military identity card for those athletes, who are authorized to present their military identity cards abroad,
 - 2. A form of verification (in English and/or French) of military status accompanied by a passport.
- E. By signing the final entry, the Chief of Delegation confirms the military status of the participating athletes. If there are last minute changes in the participation of the athletes, the verification file may be signed by the Chief of Mission, but shall be confirmed by the Chief of Delegation by official letter.
- F. If one of these documents is not available, participation is refused.
- G. An athlete who has represented one country in CISM competitions (World Military Championship, World Games, World Winter Games, continental and regional championship), in the Olympic Games, or in any competition at world, continental or regional level recognized by the relevant IF, and who has changed his/her nationality or acquired a new nationality, may participate in CISM competitions representing his/her new country provided that at least two years have passed since the competitor last represented his/her former country.

Article 7.26. PARTICIPATION OF AN INACTIVE MEMBER NATION

Athletes or teams of an inactive CISM member nation may not participate in any CISM event (art 1.10 of the Regulations).

Article 7.32. CHIEF OF MISSION

A. Chief of Mission

1. Chiefs of Mission shall be familiar with CISM regulations.
2. Missions must not only participate or be present at sports events, they are also required to participate in information conferences on CISM, study days, commemorative and cultural events and ceremonies organized by the host nation.

B. Conduct of a mission

1. The Chief of Mission is responsible for the behavior of his team in sports and general discipline. He shall ensure that members of his mission respect the rules and directives prescribed by CISM and organizers of the championship. The respect of schedules is particularly important as they form the basis for the effective conduct of competitions and ceremonies.

2. The Chief of Mission shall also enforce the rules concerning behavior and dress during the ceremonies. He plays an important role in promoting the CISM spirit among his mission, a spirit represented by friendly attitude towards other missions, courtesy towards organizers and fair-play in competition.

Article 8.6. ABSENCE OF A MISSION WITHOUT NOTIFICATION

If a mission, which submits a preliminary agreement and/or final entry, is absent without notifying the host nation in time, a sanction will be imposed (CISM Regulations, Art. 1.12).

Article 8.17. RULES OF STAY

A. General

1. The Chiefs of Mission are responsible for the discipline of their mission. The missions fall under the jurisdiction of the organizing nation. During events, all athletes present on the playing fields are equal before the jury, the referees and to themselves. No one may use his rank to impose his views on sports matters.

2. Civilian members of the missions shall conform to the discipline accepted by all other participants.

B. Military uniforms

1. Unless otherwise approved by the Official CISM Representative, all participants shall wear military uniform during official ceremonies such as the opening and closing ceremonies and medal-awarding ceremonies. Individuals without proper uniform will not be allowed to participate in the championship.

2. The presentation of medals takes place, in principle, during the closing ceremony. The presentation of medals may be done in sports uniform, if for organizational reasons it is not possible to wear military uniforms. This is the case e.g. when the presentation immediately follows a championship sports event. Sports uniforms shall respect the corresponding national criteria (training suit, sports shoes, etc.) Displaying the national flag on the podium by the recipient (athlete or team) at a medal awarding ceremony is forbidden. Individuals failing to respect these prescriptions shall not receive their medal(s) during the official ceremonies.

C. Forbidden actions

1. In conformity with the statutes and traditions of CISM, any political or religious propaganda during a CISM event, in particular the dissemination of documents, pictures, brochures, reviews, etc. is strictly forbidden.

2. Any contravention shall result in the exclusion of the mission from further competition and may result in additional sanctions (Regulations Art. 1.12).
3. CISM has a zero tolerance for all forms of harassment to include sexual harassment, and sexual assault. All allegations of harassment and sexual assault will be swiftly and completely investigated and appropriate sanctions taken.

Article 8.19. ACCOMODATIONS

E. All missions, including those of the host nation, shall be accommodated under the same conditions. If the conditions are in accordance with the CISM norms and standards, the missions are expected to accept the accommodation provided by the organizing nation.

G. (...) Any mission that does not accept the accommodations provided by the organizing nation and judged as adequate by the Official CISM Representative will not be allowed to participate in the championship.





CISM WORLD MILITARY EQUESTRIAN CHAMPIONSHIP (SHOW JUMPING) RULES

The organization of a show jumping world championship foresees, in addition to what is already in place for other championships, the provision of horses – for free - to the participating nations. As some nations do not have high level riders, the championship is run on a maximum height of 1.20m.

Each chief team must provide the OC with a Certificate of Capability for each rider. This Certificate of Capability includes a record of participation in official national/ international competitions maximum height of 1.20m.

Delegations will be composed of 3 riders, a chief of mission and a team captain.

CISM WORLD MILITARY EQUESTRIAN CHAMPIONSHIP IN SHOW JUMPING will be organized in accordance with CISM regulations for equestrian sporting events 2021:

- Annex 1: CISM EQUESTRIAN RULES FOR SHOW JUMPING
- Annex 5: COMPETITIONS WITH BORROWED HORSES
- Annex 6 : DRAW AND ALLOCATION OF HORSES

➤ **Participation**

- 9 teams: 2 per continent, including a team of the organising nation (if not already qualified).
- The application for participation will be accepted will be on a first come first participation basis.
- If a continent is represented only by one team, vacancies will then be allocated according to the order of arrival of the applications.

➤ **Chronology**

The championship will be organised on a three days basis.

1. Technical Specifications

1.1- Training Session

The warm up is held in the main Competition arena. A course with approximately 6 obstacles including a combination will be designed.

Riders have 60 seconds to complete the course or any number of obstacles on the course. The training session is observed by the Ground Jury.

Dress is informal: boots, breeches, shirt and protective headgear must be worn.

1.2- Competition Regulations

- **Day 1:** Table C, Article 239.
- **Day 2:** Accumulator competition Article 269, consists of 10 obstacles, with increasing difficulty. Combination obstacles are not allowed. For the last obstacle on

the course, one of the selective obstacles will be provided, of which one is named as Joker Obstacle.

- Day 3: Competition over two rounds, Article 273

- First round: Table A Not against the clock

- Second round: Table A Against the clock. The reverse order of penalties in the 1st round; Athletes retain their drawn order in case of equality of penalties.

➤ **Team Composition (maximum composition)**

- 3 riders;
- 1 coach;
- 1 team captain;
- All other participation will not be at the expenses of the OC.

➤ **Classification**

- For each day of competition there will be a classification.
- The first will obtain as many points as the number of participant + 1, the second will obtain as many points as the participants -1, and so on (with 20 participants: 1st 21; 2nd 19; 3rd 18....).
- Elimination: 5 negative points shall be added to the score of the last place of such grade;
- Withdrawal, retired: 7 negative points shall be added to the score of the last place of such grade.
- The final ranking of individuals will be subject to the total score obtained in the three-day competition. If there are the same scores, the winner will be determined based on the best results in Day 3.
- The final team ranking will be determined by the total score of 3 team riders in the three-day competition. If there are the same scores, the winner will be determined based on the best team results in Day 3.
- The final ranking of individuals will be subject to the total score obtained in the three-day competition. If there are the same scores, the winner will be determined based on the best results in Day 3.

➤ **Horses**

- In the championship, the Organizing Committees (OC) will provide horses capable to jump a 1.20 m height course to all participants.
- During the first technical meeting, a draw of categorized horses (A,B,C) will be made. Afterwards, these horses will be distributed to each participating team. The team leader will then designate the horse-rider couple who will participate in each day.

➤ **Grooms and veterinary service**

- Each OC will provide grooms and veterinary service.
